## A different way to see disability

A comedy about superheroes working in a supermarket and an interview exploring how an autistic man and his wife fell in love are among eight short films to be screened as part of a special Sunbury festival, *A Different Light*.

Gisborne's Emma Norton features in locally produced film *Skin Touching Sky*, which acts as a backdrop to a dance piece.

Ms Norton is a member of BoilOver,

a Sunbury Community Health (SCH)-supported group which gives people with special needs the chance to get involved in performing arts.

The keen dancer is no stranger to the big stage, having introduced the films as MC at The Other Film Festival in Melbourne.

SCH executive manager Bernie Hetherington says the festival will include a question and answer session with actors.

"It's a great opportunity to not only showcase some interesting and thought-provoking films but to highlight the experience of people with disabilities," she says.
