A NEW food truck shaped like a teapot and dubbed the Communi-TEA van is set to become a roving landmark in Sunbury.

The aim of the truck is to promote community conversations and will be available to hire for

community groups, schools and other organisations.

The van will make its first appearance at this Saturday's free twilight movie at the Village Green from 8.30pm, organised by Sunbury Community Health (SCH).

"This is a unique and

valuable way for people to get to know their neighbours in a busy world," SCH building healthy communities executive manager Bernadette Hetherington said.

"The van is a tool to encourage people to start

talking and rebuilding community connections."
