StreetLife Festival to boost business

SUNBURY StreetLife founder Sharyn Snook aspires to get everyone living in the town to the festival this Sunday.

The festival, now in its fifth year, is growing fast. It started in 2013, with both Brook and O'Shanassy streets closed, attracting about 2000 people.

The last two events saw 10,000 people congregate for entertainment and food. "We'd hope to extend it more - we'd love to get everyone from Sunbury down," Ms Snook said.

"It's a way to showcase what shops and businesses are doing, and reminding people of why Sunbury is so great."

Ms Snook has taken the spirit of the Sunbury business collective a step further by opening the Homegrown giftware shop in O'Shanassy St.

All proceeds from the day will go to the Sunbury Early Childhood Intervention program.

Heavenly memories

ST MARY'S Anglican Church, which once hosted the wedding of English cricket captain Ivo Bligh to his Sunbury sweetheart, will celebrate 150 years in the community this week.

The bluestone building sits prominently within the Village Green and is linked to Clarke family.

Sir William Clarke was behind the drive to build the church, using connections to source one acre of land from the State Government following an 1863 meeting.

He, in part, wanted to bring together those working hard on the bridges and rail between Sunbury and Riddells Creek. They had been meet-

ing in ad hoc congregations in camps.

The marriage of Mr Bligh to Florence Morphy occurred on February 11, a year after he led the 1882-83 tour of Australia by the English team "to regain the Ashes".

Services and other celebrations will be held this week, including a picnic, old-time

crafts, ladies evening and playtime party.

Sunbury historian Peter Free will also launch his book commemorating the 150th anniversary.
